Principal's Address

I can't believe a whole term has passed since I started at MRSHS. In many ways it feels like I have been here for much longer than that, but in other ways it seems like I have barely started. I guess many of our Year 12's are experiencing similar feelings as they prepare to leave the school. Five years at high school passes very quickly yet the students have changed dramatically in that time.

The Semester 2 exams for Year 12 students will be finished by the time you



read this newsletter. The students have now completed their course work and school assessment for the year. Now the really important job of preparing for the WACE exams in November commences. An effective study regime definitely has a direct and positive impact on the final ATAR score achieved by students. The final examinations count towards 50% of the marks allocated for each course, and they are also used to adjust the scores submitted by the school to ensure each school across the state assesses the students fairly. When many of students from a school study hard and perform very well in the WACE exams, the school scores submitted by the school are likely to be adjusted upwards. It might seem a little strange, but everyone in the class benefits when others perform strongly in the final exams.

Many of our Year 12's who are not sitting exams have been out of the school on Work Placement. This is a fabulous opportunity for students to

develop skills in the workplace and build important networks with employers. Organising Work Placement is a very time consuming process and I must thank our Careers team for their efforts. I would also like to thank our Work Place employers as the program would not be possible without their support and understanding and we really appreciate the opportunities that they provide for our students.

Our second formal parent night for 2016 has just been held and I sincerely hope that parents have found the feedback informative and useful. If anyone has feedback on the format or timing of the event, please contact me on 9757 0700.

Term 3 has been a very busy term for staff and students. We have had many extra-curricular activities such as excursions and competitions running through the term and it impossible for me to name them all. I have been impressed with the diversity of opportunities available for students at Margaret River, the commitment of staff to make them available and the support of parents to ensure they occur.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a safe and happy holiday period and maybe we will even see some very welcome sunshine.

"Students from Margaret River Senior High School dominated competition at the State Final of the SunSmart WA School Surfing Titles, claiming their schools 12th consecutive Champion School Title at Trigg Beach on Friday.

The conclusion to a two-week long, state-wide search for WA's best school surfing talent saw surfers and bodyboarders from 26 regional and metropolitan high schools converge on Trigg Beach to decide who would be crowned Western Australia's Champion Surfing School for 2016.

The State Final brought together over 100 competitors who made the most of wind-affected conditions along Perth's metropolitan beaches.

Margaret River Senior High School proved unstoppable, claiming an incredible and record breaking 12th consecutive Champion School victory ahead of Mandurah Catholic College, Prendiville College and Christchurch Grammar School.

Margaret River had all bases covered with their depth of talent and experience clearly on display as they won four of the eight divisional finals on offer.

Margaret River Senior High's Ben Spence and Jack Haslau, won the hotly contested 18 & Under Senior Boys surfing final. The pair from Margaret River tore apart anything that came their way posting a combined total of 32.50 (from a possible 40) and in turn qualifying for the National Titles on Phillip Island.

"It's been a great day and to win with one of my best mates is pretty cool," said Haslau. "We'd like to dedicate our win to our teacher Scott Cameron and his family who are going through some tough times at the moment."

Emi Campbell and Phoebe McGregor claimed victory in the 18 & Under Senior Girls surfing division, defeating schoolmates Maddie Cawood and Arabelle Gibson. Campbell and McGregor scored a combined total of 29.00 (from a possible 40) and also booked their place into the Australian Junior Surfing Titles with the win.

"Surfing is such an individual sport that it's really unique opportunity to compete with a team mate," said Campbell. "We're all here doing this for our teachers Scott and Tracy Cameron and they'd be thrilled with our win."

Farewell to our Year 12's


We would like to farewell our Year 12's as they enter the world of training, employment or further study.




