Some parents in our community are able to access Student Allowance funding of up to \$350.00 to assist them with the payment of Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges and the purchase of uniforms. The Secondary Assistance Scheme consists of two allowances, the Educational Program Allowance (EPA) of \$235.00 and Clothing Allowance of \$115.00). Further information can be found on page 4.

# VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND COMPULSORY CHARGES

All Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges assist in providing an educational program that meets the requirements of the Curriculum and comply with the guidelines issued by the Department of Education and the Education Act.

The school community is appreciative of the financial support given by parents and guardians which enables staff to continue to offer quality educational programs, *at the lowest possible cost to families*. The School Board approves and endorses the level of voluntary contributions, compulsory charges, extra cost optional components and voluntary approved requests.

Please note that charges will roll over every year. If you are having payment difficulties please contact the Manager Corporate Services to arrange a payment plan on 9757 0704.

## VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

A voluntary payment **requested** from parents goes towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by Year 7 to 10 students in their educational program. A breakdown of how these funds are allocated is detailed for each year group further into this booklet.

Parent contributions go towards the cost of certain materials, services and facilities directly used or consumed by students. The costs are detailed on the school Voluntary Contributions and Charges list. It is expected that those who can afford to will make the contribution.

## COMPULSORY CHARGES

Relates to any costs for which payment is compulsory. Compulsory Charges for Years 7 to 10 are applied to elective subjects which student/parents have selected. Year 11 and 12 are considered post-compulsory and therefore all charges are considered compulsory.

## EXTRA COST OPTIONAL COMPONENTS

These are voluntary courses and activities where a selection is made by the parents or student to participate e.g. social events, excursions, camps, carnivals etc. A full list of these can be found on pages 16 to 18. Please note that these prices are an indication of the most parents would be expected to pay, organisers will be negotiating the best possible price for students.

## PERSONAL ITEMS AND SUBJECT RESOURCES.

A separate information sheet is supplied for each year group outlining Personal Items and specific Subject Resources that students require for the year. These items are able to be sourced from any supplier.

## LIBRARY TECHNOLOGY — \$25.00 PER STUDENT

## **VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS**

### **SCHOOL CHAPLAINCY — \$5.00 PER STUDENT**

The school is privileged to have one Chaplain as part of our Student Services team being Kathryn Seisun. The Chaplain work mainly with students who are experiencing difficulties in their personal life. Their involvement with students and their families has been invaluable on occasions such as bereavements and legal matters, where they can act as a friend and mediator. The Chaplain is also available to support staff and parents at times of crisis.

### **HEALTH CENTRE — \$5.00 PER STUDENT**

A Community Nurse, who is registered by the Nurses' Board, staffs the Health Centre. The nurse promotes the health and wellbeing of the student community, conducts assessments and provides intervention in terms of health information, referral, liaison and support. Health related information, training and resources are also provided to school staff to enable health management strategies including a coordinated approach to addressing first aid and emergency health situations.

The Health Centre request is used to purchase necessary supplies including band aids, tissues, sanitary pads, bandages, slings, Ventolin, dressing material, hot and cold packs.

### **P & C — \$20.00 PER STUDENT**

This contribution is our main source of funding and in conjunction with the canteen and uniform shop profits means we do not have to fundraise. This leave the committee's time available to help ensure the right resources are available to the students in the school for a safe value driven educational environment.

Our main philosophy is that funds will be spent on resources which will benefit the most students. If parents do not attend the meetings they will not get a say in where the money will be spent. So we encourage parents to participate by attending meetings to ensure their voice is heard.

## **STUDENT ALLOWANCES—SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME**

In order to access this scheme, parents or legal guardians must hold one of the following cards:

- ♦ Centrelink Family Health Care Card.
- ♦ Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card.
- ♦ Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

### **a. Education Program Allowance —subject to eligibility**

An amount of \$235.00 will be paid to the school for eligible parents/guardians of students in Years 7 to 12. This is applied towards the Voluntary Contributions in the first instance, then applied against Charges.

### **b. Clothing Allowance Payment**

Claimants who satisfy the eligibility criteria will receive a payment of \$115.00. Parents may nominate the Clothing Allowance be paid directly to the school, to be applied to Voluntary Contributions and Charges.

## SCHOOL POLICY

The school recognises that the socio-economic background of many families requires special consideration. Financial consideration will be given to those families in genuine need; however, families also need to recognise that there are considerable constraints in operating a school.

The school's costing structure and tight budget relies heavily on prompt payment of school Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges. Prompt payment also minimises administration time and costs involved in following up outstanding charges.

1. Accounts will be posted to parents at the beginning of the year. Reminder statements will be posted during the year or emailed to families where payments have not been made by the due date. This will be followed up with phone calls where necessary. If accounts remain outstanding and no contact is received from families within the specified time, an interview will be required with the Manager Corporate Services or Principal to discuss the development of a payment plan.
2. Where a student's current year Compulsory Charges have not been paid in full, the School Board has endorsed a 50% confirmation charge for extra cost optional components for the following year.
3. Parents/guardians are encouraged to make contact with the school's Manager Corporate Services if they are experiencing difficulties paying Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges by the due date. The Manager Corporate Services or Principal have the discretion to negotiate and recommend a payment arrangement that is suitable to both the family and the school. A payment arrangement, once established, will be expected to be adhered to.
4. Where parents/guardians fail to respond to communication from the school and/or will not come to an arrangement on the payment, a Collection Agency will be engaged to recover outstanding charge.

## REFUND POLICY

The refund or transfer of charges and voluntary contributions will be completed in accordance with the Department's "Refunds of Charges and Voluntary Contributions in Secondary Schools" documentation.

Payments, including deposits for camps, excursions and incursions will not be refundable where there has been a cost to the school.

The School Board has endorsed refunds to be issued for amounts of \$30.00 and above, amounts below \$30.00 will be credited to the student's account and will be used to offset other costs as directed by parents.

### Computer Printing Credits
