The rush that comes at the end of Second Term has once again caught up with us. Semester 1 reports will soon be sent home to parents. I also encourage parents to contact the teachers of their children, to work together, to ensure all students reach their potential at Margaret River Senior High School.



We are getting a lot of families going on holidays during the term. Whilst, we understand that the taking of holidays is often beyond the control of parents, the absences due to these holidays has a significant impact on student learning. The school does not provide work for students who go on holidays and assessments that are missed can't often not be caught up on. This is particularly pertinent for Certificate and upper school courses which will effect students' final grades. Students who go on School, State or Australian representation are provided work and missed assessments are taken into consideration when their final mark is being determined.

We are currently working on our timetable for 2020. Mr Chris Buckland has visited all feeder primary schools and presented enrolment packages in Term 1 to students who have indicated that in 2020 they will attend Margaret River SHS in Year 7. If there are any parents who are yet to enrol their children, I would encourage them to do so as this will enable us to formalise offerings for this year group for next year. I thank parents for their assistance in this area.

In two weeks, our Country Week teams will leave for Perth to represent the school in a variety of sports throughout the week. This is a great experience for the staff and students who attend this event and I would like to thank Mr Shane Joyce and the Country Week coaches for their efforts in organising teams for the week. 

School Build Update

The current school build is progressing well. The farm buildings are now operational and the staff, contractors and students are re-establishing the vegetable garden, orchard, hydroponics and aquaculture programs.

The gymnasium, general learning area and science block are due to be completed by the end of August this year.

Once we occupy the new buildings the 16 transportable classrooms and offices will be removed from site. This will allow work to commence on the redevelopment of a small playing field. Work will include extensive drainage and new soil and turf.

Additional works will continue on the Margaret River Education Campus to provide extensive car parking and drop off areas. Work will also be completed on the western side of Bussell Highway to provide more bus bays and drop off points for parents. A foot and cycle path will connect the school and M.R.E.C.

We are looking forward to getting students into the new facilities and expect all works to be completed for the commencement of the 2020 school year.

West Side of General Learning Area and Gymnasium

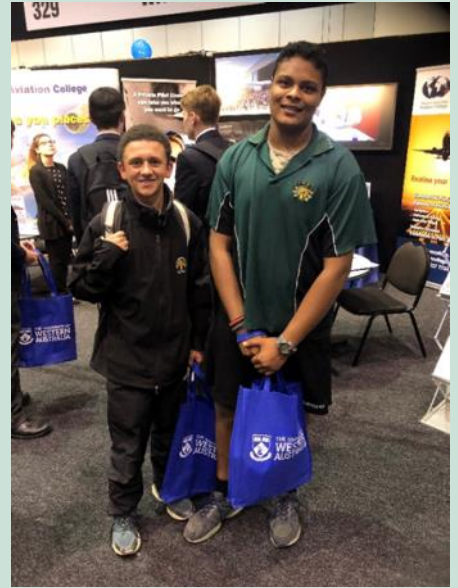

Year 11 Certificate II Outdoor Recreation Caving Excursion

On Tuesday, 14 May, the Year 11 Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation students spent time in the Boranup Forest scrambling through a series of restricted access caves. Prior to spending the day 'spelunking', the students spent time in classes learning how the Leeuwin Naturalist Ridge was formed, the mechanisms through which caves are formed, different speleothems (cave formations) and how they are formed, flora and fauna specific to caves in this region and how to minimise their impact whilst visiting the caves.

The Year 11 students were given the opportunity to explore Nannup Cave, well known for its high level of cave decoration. They also explored Dingo Cave, regarded as the most adventurous restricted caves in the area incorporating an abseil entry down a solution pipe and plenty of squeezes through tight spaces.

The excursion afforded the Year 11's the opportunity to further address units of competency relating to abseiling, belaying, minimal impact practices, preparing for recreational activities and OHS.

Many thanks again to Mick Dempsey of the Margaret River Climbing Co., whose presence allowed two caving instructors on site to facilitate concurrent cave visits in smaller groups, maximising the experience for all students involved.

Certificate II Outdoor Recreation



Year 12 Certificate II Outdoor Recreation Caving Excursion

On Friday, 17 May, the Year 12 Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation students spent a day in the Boranup Forest completing their requirements for their 'Caving' and 'Responds to Emergency Situations' units of competency. The students spent time in classes revising speleology covered last year and personal and group planning for the excursion itself.

The excursion was conducted at Brides Cave, abseiling into the large cave doline, visiting the cave and exiting via cave ladders with safety belays operated by students. After lunch break, the day culminated with an emergency response scenario in which a patient with a broken leg required stabilisation. The first aid and extraction from the cave used vertical rope systems set up and also manned by the students. This is a vital assessment tool that presents the students the opportunity to utilise a wide range of roping, belaying, first aid and emergency response skills acquired over the course.

Many thanks again to Mick Dempsey of the Margaret River Climbing Co., whose presence allowed two caving/roping instructors on site, ensuring the safety of all students involved at all times.

Year 10 Information to Parents—Year 11 2020

This time of year is a busy time for the Year 10's as they start to think about their options for upper school. Your young adults have been busy in Career IT exploring these options and possible pathway plans for their future transition from schooling.

The course options for Year 11 at MRSHS for 2020 will be found on the website after June 17th.

In Term 3 we will have several important dates that will keep you informed of this process.

On **Thursday, 25 July (Week 1)** we will have our second parent night in the **School Auditorium at 6pm**. We will revisit the key elements from the first session and then break into two groups – ATAR and VET pathways. Each Year 10 Counsellor will be at this night to introduce themselves and answer any questions.

In Week 2 of Term 3 students selecting an ATAR pathway or courses will need to get recommendations signed off by the appropriate HOLA.

In Week 3 to 6 each Year 10 student will have a counselling session with a staff member and parents to make course selections and discuss their individual pathway planning. The counsellor will call you during this time to make an appointment that is mutually agreeable.

This process will be ongoing over Semester 2 and staff will be available to answer questions at any time. All course directed questions should go directly to their teacher or the HOLA of that area.

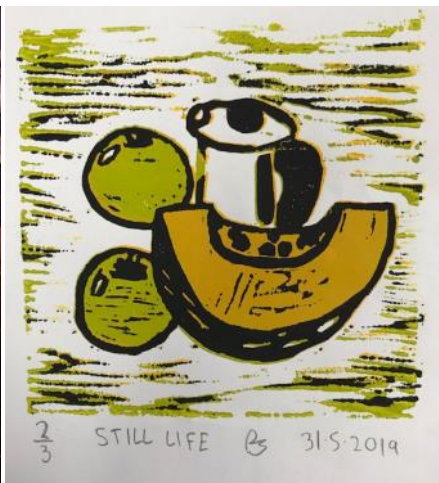

Sisterhood is currently run 2-3 times per term. The program is facilitated by myself, School Chaplain, and Kristy Palmer, School Library Officer. This program is well supported by volunteers and sponsors from the community.

Term 1

Session 1: Intro to *Sisterhood*, Self-esteem survey and Topics of Interest survey, and awesome prizes donated from Bunnings Margaret River to coincide with our theme this year – **GROWTH**.

Session 2: Launch of our *Sisterhood Passions Project* – encouraging girls to design their own affirmations and create merchandise for a charity.

Session 3: Guest Speaker – **Nakita Kitson** (one of our English teachers) shared about her charity in Cambodia – **Stellar Foundation**. Plans discussed to support this charity with the merchandise from the *Sisterhood Passions Project*.



Term 2

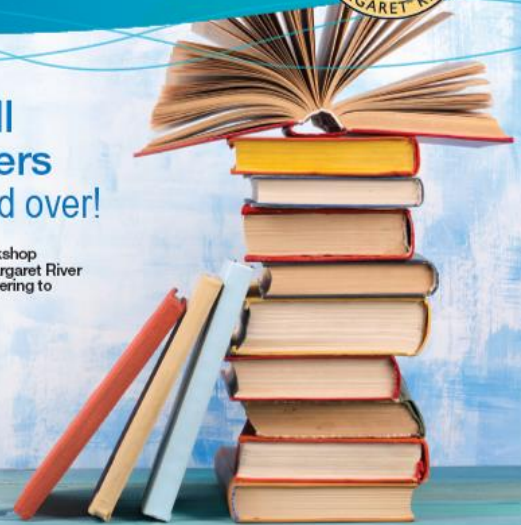
