<u>Suturing</u>

On 26th July, a bunch of 4th and 5th year, enthusiastic university students from across the Metropolitan area came to visit our school. They were all members of the Spinrphex club based in Perth.

Spinrphex is a Western Australian rural health club for students studying medicine, dentistry or nursing at any WA university. These aspiring health care professionals are a part of a rural school outreach program.

This is focused on educating young people (aka our wonderful students) about the range of health careers available to them after graduation, how to gain entry into associated courses using available

alternative pathways and emphasizing that there is a real need for health care professionals, particularly in our country regions.

Students were provided with the opportunity to have any of their questions answered, followed by some hands-on surgical experience whereby students learnt how to suture (stitch together) potentially gaping wounds using genuine suturing equipment and technique, improvising gaping wounds with a pig's trotter.

Needless to say, some students were better at this than others but plenty of fun was had by all.

Year 12 Biology

Our 18-strong Biology crew were recently involved in some seriously extreme heightening and lowering of body temperature whereby 2 brave volunteers willingly subjected themselves to icy temperatures and 2 more to uncomfortably hot conditions.

With feet immersed in icy and hot water respectively, fans cranking, air conditioning or heaters on, students in acceptable near-naked dress code or overwhelmed with warm clothing and blankets, their vital readings were recorded by assisting team members every couple of minutes over a half hour duration. Group members monitored core and peripheral temperatures, heart rate and blood pressure continually and noted associated levels of distress reported by their subjects.

Why? Why Not? It's all in the name of SCIENCE in this case, to help us understand and appreciate the incredible workings of our own body and hopefully instil an appreciation of the need to look after it.




