

SCSA

All courses that are studied at school in Year 11 and 12 are registered ,monitored and accredited with the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA)

SCSA will produce the Western Australian Statement of Student Achievement (WASSA) to all Year 12 students at the completion of their Secondary Schooling



What is a WACE?

To achieve a WACE a student must:

- 1. Demonstrate minimum Literacy and Numeracy.
- 2. Complete a minimum of 20 units or equivalent.
- 3. Complete four Year 12 ATAR courses
- 4. At least 5 Year 12 General courses and/or ATAR or equivalent OR Certificate II(or higher)qualification in a combination with ATAR and General.
- 5. Complete ten year 12 units.
- 6. Complete two Year 11 and two Year 12 English units.
- 7. Complete one pair of Year 12 course units from each of List A & B.



WACE

Achievement Standard

14 'C' Grades over Year 11 and 12, including at least 6 'C' Grades in Year 12.



Courses

Students may study:

- W.A.C.E Courses: Western Australian Certificate of Education – Both General and ATAR
- V.E.T. Courses: Vocational Education and Training.
- Endorsed Programs.

These all count towards WACE achievement.



What types of courses are there?

- There are WACE courses across a range of learning areas.
- These are grouped into List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology).
 Students must select one list B course.
- You must do English in Year 11 and Year 12.
- Students will undertake a <u>minimum of 6 courses</u> in Year 11.



What types of courses are there?

 ATAR courses – for students who are aiming to go directly from school to university will need to sit an external exam which will get them an ATAR. (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank)

 General courses – for students aiming to enter further training or the workforce straight from school. These are not examined externally.



ATAR Courses

To be successful in ATAR courses students generally need to:

- 1. **Be achieving an A or <u>high</u> B** grade in that subject in Year 10.
- 2. **Be recommended** to do the course by the Head of the Learning Area.
- 3. Perform well under test and exam conditions.
- 4. Have **good independent study habits** and a strong history of completing homework and home study.



- Can lead to a **Certificate of Merit or Distinction**.





YEAR 11 AND 12 PATHWAYS WHAT IS THE MEASURE OF SUCCESS?

- Year 11 and 12 is a journey
- The destination is the end result
- The courses of study provide the maps, resources, experience and the confidence to reach the destination/ not a migration !!

What other programs are there?

- <u>General pathway students are HIGHLY encouraged to do a</u> <u>Certificate Qualification for currency and TAFE articulation</u>
- <u>Vocational Education and Training</u> (VET) Nationally accredited Certificate II & III qualification in school delivery/ TAFE offsite delivery
- School Based Traineeships
- School Based Apprenticeships = Pre-App paid, on the job training, 1-2 days per week Certificate II qualification
- <u>Endorsed programs</u> which contribute to WACE equivalence and address areas of learning not covered by courses.




Vocational Education and Training Programs

- VET is an option for all Year 11 and 12 students
- VET programs are nationally accredited.
- VET provides credit towards the number of course units students need to complete to achieve their WACE.
- VET provides prerequisites for further study at TAFE and alternative entry to Universities.
- VET courses at MRSHS are delivered at school and off campus.



Endorsed Programs Workplace Learning

- All MRSHS VET students are enrolled in and complete WPL.
- Workplace Learning is a highly structured, highly regarded TAFE prerequisite course for admission to ALL Tafe courses.
- Acknowledges Work and Training Readiness
- Teaches employability skills
- Unpaid
- Expectation of industry standards, start and finish time, attendance etc
- Students may accrue a maximum of two Year 11 units and two Year 12 units in Workplace Learning to contribute towards their WACE.
- Eligibility criteria to be met for some courses eg Elite Sport Performance



SCHOOL BASED TRAINEESHIPS AND APPRENTICESHIPS

- Government funded or privately indentured
- On the job training and learning
- Training auspiced by Registered Training Organisation
- 18 month committment
- Students paid a training award wage
- 1 or 2 day/s per week work, including school holidays
- Includes WPL
- Certificate II qualification
- Trade qual = pre apprenticeship, reduces apprenticeship time by 6 months
- Variable opportunities/ driven by industry and labour market




Senior School Engagement Program (SSEP)

- incorporate flexible options and opportunities to exit school to employment, training or a combination of both.
