### Principal's Address

The rush that comes at the end of Second Term has once again caught up with us. It has been an extremely unusual and challenging term and I would like to thank parents for the support and encouragement they have provided the staff at MRSHS.

Year 7,8 9 and 10 Semester 1 reports will soon be sent home to parents this term with the Year 11 and 12 reports sent early in Term 3. Due to the disruption caused by COVID-19 the reports will contain the following information:

Year 7 -10 – Reports will contain a comment and attributes only.

Year 11 – A full report will be provided.

Year 12 – The report will be a statement of results.

These reports provide parents and students a good indication of their academic progress through the first half of 2020. I encourage parents to review the reports with their children, highlighting and celebrating areas of success and examining areas where improvements can be made. I also encourage parents to contact the teachers of their children, to work together, to ensure all students reach their potential at Margaret River Senior High School.

I would like to thank the Margaret River SHS P and C for their financial support in providing funds for the school to install a video wall into our school gymnasium. This is a significant financial outlay by the P and C and will result in the school being able to provide additional learning and reward opportunities for students in the gymnasium.

We are currently working on our timetable for 2021. Mr Chris Buckland has visited all feeder primary schools and presented enrolment packages in Term 1 to students who have indicated that in 2021 they will attend Margaret River SHS in Year 7. If there are any parents who are yet to enrol their children, I would encourage them to do so as this will enable us to formalise offerings for this year group for next year. I thank parents for their assistance in this area.

At the beginning of 2020 I wrote to parents outlining the drop off and pick up zones for students, as a result of roadworks. The procedures put in place for this time period are now going to be our standard set of procedures. Students pick up and drop off for parents is at the South of the school, in our new carpark situated adjacent to the MREC building. This enables parents to enter the carpark through the north entry off Bussell Highway and exit through the South exit onto Bussell Highway. Student parking is also in this carpark area. Parents can drop off their children, in the morning, in the bus bays in front of the school. The carparks adjacent to the Administration Building are for staff only parking. We appreciate parents cooperation in making pick up and drop off safe for our students.

I would like to remind parents that the school uniform is compulsory. I thank parents for their support in this area so far in 2020. Parents can access information in relation to the school uniform from either the front administration office or via our website: www.margaretrivershs.wa.edu.au.

# **Mobile Phone Policy Reminder**

The State Government announced a new Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools policy that took effect in Term 1, 2020.

The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. This extends to the use of smart watches which need to be on airplane mode  $\rightarrow$  during this period. The policy aims to reduce distractions in class and improve student engagement.

Please note the DOE Mobile Phone policy is in line with our current Margaret River Senior High School Mobile Phone policy. A copy of the MRSHS Mobile Phone policy can be accessed here: <u>www.margaretrivershs.wa.edu.au/</u> <u>download/15355/</u>

In the policy, secondary students are allowed to have their phones in their possession but must turn them off and keep them out of sight until the end of school. Exceptions are allowed for students who have approval to use a phone to monitor health conditions, or where teachers give students permission to use mobile phones for a specific purpose.

# Year 10 Information to Parents – Year 11 2021



This time of year is a busy time for the Year 10's as they start to think about their options for Upper School. Your young adults have been busy in Career IT exploring these options and possible pathway plans for their future transition from schooling.

In Term 3 we will have several important dates that will keep you informed of this process.

### Week 1: Parent Night, 6pm Thursday 23rd July

Thursday 23rd of July at 6pm we will have our first parent night in the School Auditorium. We will focus on the general components of Upper School and then break into ATAR and General/VET pathways. Each Year 10 Counsellor will be at this night to introduce themselves and answer any questions.

NOTE: Due to COVID restrictions an <u>online booking</u> system link will be sent out in Week 10 and it is **vital that all parents RSVP**.

### Week 3: ATAR Pathway/Course HOLA Sign off

In Week 3 students selecting an ATAR pathway or courses will need to get recommendations signed off by the appropriate HOLA.

### Week 4—6: Year 10 Student and Parent subject counselling sessions

In Week 4 – 6 each Year 10 student and an accompanying parent/guardian will be scheduled to have a counselling session with a staff member to make course selections and discuss their individual pathway planning. The Counsellor will call you during this time to make an appointment that is mutually agreeable.

This process will be ongoing over Semester Two and staff will be available to answer questions at any time. All course directed questions should go directly to their teacher or the HOLA of that area.

# **Outdoor Education**

### YEAR 11 BELAYING/ABSEILING/CLIMBING

On Friday 19th June, the Year 11 Outdoor Education students travelled to Wilyabrup Sea Cliffs to put their abseiling, climbing and safety belaying skills they have developed in class to the test in a natural and challenging environment. This is essential to provide the students with the opportunity to demonstrate competency in abseiling and single rope top-line belaying/ climbing and bottom-line belaying.

A series of climbs and an abseils (all with belay systems where students provide the necessary safety protocols for each other) were rigged and manned by two qualified instructors affording the students many opportunities over the course of the day.

Students were required to not just abseil and climb, but also to safely attach an abseiler or climber, carry out all safety checks, connect and operate a top-line belay ensuring the safety of the abseiler or climber.

The weather was amazing for this time of year, sunny and mild conditions with gentle winds.



The students displayed very good skills and safety awareness and practices ensuring a rewarding experience for all, both students and instructors.

Special thanks to Mick Dempsey of the Margaret River Climbing Co. for lending us his expertise on the day. We are very fortunate as a school to have been able to draw on his services for many years and look forward to continuing this into the future.

### **SPECIAL REPORT: Coronavirus - The Transition Back**

As lockdown restrictions are slowly being lifted to varying degrees, we enter a time of transition and adjustment. The circumstances of this situation have significantly impacted us all. For some it has been an opportunity to reflect on what is important, whilst others have embraced the opportunity to learn new things.

Many young people may be excited at the prospect of restrictions being lifted; others may feel mixed emotions. Reactions will differ depending on how well they cope with stress and change. Keeping a check on your child's mental health and wellbeing as they adjust to new routines, will be vitally important.

There is still a lot of uncertainty ahead of us, so focusing on the things you can control or enjoy doing or even value, can help establish predictability and familiarity for the whole family. Adult carers need to provide young people with reassurance by acknowledging any concerns and fears they may have at this time. Consider this to be a normal reaction, however it may be best to focus more on their feelings and emotions, rather than the practicalities at this stage.

In this Special Report, we share a few ideas to help ease this time of transition and adjustment. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this Special Report, and as always, we welcome your feedback.
