Charges & Contributions Policy

THE LEGAL POSITION

The State Government, through the Department of Education, provides placement at educational facilities for all students who choose to attend Government schools. The Department pays for the wages of all teaching and non-teaching positions plus costs such as repairs, maintenance and utilities. However, the government does not provide most of the goods and services students use and it is reasonable for parents to meet these costs.



WHO SHOULD PAY?

Given that all students benefit from the pool of collected contributions and charges, it is fair to expect that all parents should contribute for this pool. Parents of students who choose more expensive option subjects need to consider the costs during the subject selection process.

WHERE DO CHARGES & CONTRIBUTIONS GO?

Some examples include: ingredients in home economics, transport, photographic equipment and supplies, art materials, timber, metals, consumable tools, external instructors, sporting equipment, text books etc.

A COMPASSIONATE VIEW

This school is aware that the payment of school contributions and charges can be a burden for some families. Part payments, deferred payments and credit card debits are all available to support parents experiencing difficulties. In some cases of financial hardship, the Principal will consider full or partial waiver of contributions and charges. Please complete the financial hardship form for further assessment. Ignoring accounts and reminders is unhelpful to all parties. The school is also keen to assist parents in selecting options that they can afford. To this end, subject charges will always be provided to parents prior to the selection of subjects. If parents are having difficulty paying contribution and charges, please contact the Manager Corporate Services, Cristina Oliveira to discuss possible payment options.

HOW MUCH CAN BE CHARGED?

Year 7-10

Voluntary contributions are directly applied to each learning area to support your child's education by enabling the school to purchase extra materials, services and resources that are used daily in the classroom. At \$235.00 per year, this works out to less than \$6 per week or \$58.78 per term.

Charges are applied to the elective subjects that the students and parents have selected, for which payment is compulsory. Please note if payment is not received by the due date, your child will be placed into a lower course cost option.

Year 10 parents who have not paid charges will be asked to make an upfront payment of 50% of the cost of Year 11 charges and enter into a payment plan to ensure their child is enrolled in their selected course.

Year 11-12

Subject charges are applied based on your child's selected subjects for Year 11 and 12 and are compulsory. The school works on a cost recovery basis and aims to keep costs to a minimum, to maintain maximum value for money for our families.

Year 11 parents who have not paid charges are to enter into a payment plan before the new year commences to cover Year 11 and Year 12 charges.

Year 12 parents that have not paid charges by the due date (end of Term 1) are to enter into a payment plan with MRSHS. The balance of Year 12 school charges needs to be paid by early November to allow parents to attend school events including the Valedictory Ceremony.

Certificate Courses

Please note that for enrolment in a certificate course a 50% deposit is required by 6th Dec 2024 or a payment plan entered via Compass. If payment is not received by due date students will be withdrawn from course. Any withdrawal after last day of term one (11 April 2025) will incur the full course

COLLECTING CHARGES & CONTRIBUTIONS

The school will take a positive approach to collecting contributions from parents of students in Years 7 to 10. In particular, the school will highlight the benefits to students if all parents meet their contributions. With respect to charges for Years 7 to 12, the school will actively seek full payment of charges.

The School Board, in support of this process, has endorsed the following actions:

- Regular accounts sent home to parents.
- Students whose family has a history of non-payment will be refused enrolment in high-cost subjects for any year group.
- Year 10, 11 and 12 high-cost subjects will require a 50% confirmation charge prior to enrolment if the outstanding balance is not fully paid.
- Parents who refuse to communicate with the school and have made no effort to pay charges, will be referred to a debt collection agency as permitted in the regulations.
- Sanctions on extra curriculum activities may be imposed at the discretion of the Principal. This could include camps, school socials and sporting activities and participation in other events, as stated above.

VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

The following requests also appear on student Charges & Contributions account.

P & C

This contribution is our main source of funding and, in conjunction with the uniform shop profits, means we do not have to fundraise. This leaves the committee's time available to help ensure the right resources are available to the students in the school for a safe, value driven educational environment.

Our main philosophy is that funds will be spent on resources which will benefit the most students. If parents do not attend the meetings, they will not get a say in where the money will be spent. So, we encourage parents to participate by attending meetings to ensure their voice is heard.

Technology

At Margaret River SHS we ask all parents to contribute to keep the school up to date with technology. The money generated by this charge will directly help your child develop 21st Century Skills that will be with them for the rest of their lives. The contribution is used to fund a wide range of infrastructure and resources that could not be provided without your help, they include but not limited to:

Medical Centre

A Community Nurse, who is registered by the Nurses' Board, staffs the Medical Centre. The nurse promotes the health and wellbeing of the student community, conducts assessments and provides intervention in terms of health information, referral, liaison and support. Health related information, training and resources are also provided to school staff to enable health management strategies including a coordinated approach to addressing first aid and emergency health situations.

The Medical Centre request is used to purchase necessary supplies including band aids, tissues, sanitary pads, bandages, slings, Ventolin, dressing material, hot and cold packs.

Library

School Chaplain

The school is privileged to be a part of the Chaplaincy program. The Chaplain works mainly with students who are experiencing difficulties in their personal life. Their involvement with students and their families has been invaluable on occasions such as bereavements and legal matters, where they can act as a friend and mediator. The Chaplain is also available to support staff and parents at times of crisis.

Education Program Allowance

SUBJECT TO ELIGIBILITY

An amount of \$235.00 will be paid to the school for eligible parents/guardians of students in Years 7 to 12. This is applied towards the Voluntary Contributions in the first instance, then applied against Charges.

Clothing Allowance Payment

Claimants who satisfy the eligibility criteria will receive a payment of \$300.00. Parents may nominate the Clothing Allowance be paid directly to the school, to be applied to Voluntary Contributions and Charges.

ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance Supplement

Assistance for secondary school Aboriginal students may be available to supplement the ABSTUDY payments. Parents should contact Centrelink.

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REFUND POLICY

The refund or transfer of charges and voluntary contributions will be completed in accordance with the Department's "Refunds of Charges and Voluntary Contributions in Secondary Schools" documentation.

Payments, including deposits for camps, excursions and incursions will not be refundable where there has been a cost to the school.

The School Board has endorsed refunds to be issued for amounts of \$30.00 and above, amounts below \$30.00 will be credited to the student's account and will be used to offset other costs as directed by parents.

- If a student is withdrawn after 28th Feb, but before the last day of term one, a no more than a 50% credit of course cost; subject to the conditions of the auspicing RTO, may be applied.
- Any withdrawal after last day of term one (11 April 2025) will incur the full course fee.
