What other WACE programs are there?

Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs and Endorsed Programs which contribute to WACE

equivalence and address areas of learning not covered by general and ATAR courses. If a student chooses not to complete the course requirements to achieve an ATAR, we strongly recommend that they complete *minimum of a Certificate II* in addition to their other Course enrolments to achieve their WACE.

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The Australian Qualifications Framework



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Vocational Education and Training Programs

A VET or Certificate Course are different to other courses or subjects at school.

- They are made up of **Units of Competency** these are like building blocks. The number varies from 7 to 16 depending on the level.
- They require the **collection of evidence** including written and performance of tasks.
- These courses do have a **minimum Literacy Level**.
- They have a strong **industry connection** may require work experience of 100-200 hours to complete.
- Units may require several attempts before passing (just like your drivers test), you don't pass unit you prove you can do it.
- Require the completion of everything to finalise the course. There is no averaging.



Vocational Education and Training Programs

- VET Certificates are **nationally accredited** that means Australia wide and sometimes overseas.
- VET provides credit towards the number of course units students need to complete to achieve a WACE.
- VET provides **prerequisites for further study** at TAFE and alternative entry to Universities.
- **There are limits** to the number of VET programs that may contribute to achievement of the WACE.

School Based Traineeships and Apprenticeships (SBT/SBA)

Another way to gain a certificate may be to do a traineeship or begin an apprenticeship while you are still at school.

This is 1-2 Days and is paid while you train, and continues







School Based Traineeships and Apprenticeships (SBT/SBA)

How?



- Find an employer who may like to take on someone part time.
- *Make contact with the school* to confirm information about SBT/SBA's.
- **Connect with the Support Network** to find complete all the official forms, signups and sort the training required.
- The *contracts are signed* by all parties, then changes to timetables and courses at school.
- Once completed the training and the work hours are credited to school.

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ENDORSED PROGRAMS - ADWPL WORKPLACE LEARNING

- MRSHS VET students are **encouraged to complete ADWPL**.
- This is a highly structured, **highly regarded prerequisite** course for admission to ALL TAFE courses and can assist in university alternative entry
- Acknowledges work and training readiness through recognition of transferrable skills and attributes
- Expectation of industry standards, start and finish time, attendance etc.
- Students may accrue two Year 11 units and two Year 12 units in Workplace Learning to contribute towards their WACE.
- Eligibility criteria to be met for some courses e.g. Elite Sport Performance
- Some students have commenced this in year 10 with IWIL achievement





Some Scenarios



• Jim is not sure about leaving school. He knows he wants to get a trade but doesn't feel he is ready for full time work. He is yet to get his drivers licence. He knows a few people in the building trade but has not necessarily decided which specialty.

• Jim has decided to apply for a Pre-Apprenticeship in School as a Certificate II in Building and Construction. He needs to put together his resume and school reports and apply online. If he gets selected, he will need to attend an interview, then if offered a position there would be an orientation day in Bunbury.

• When doing this course he would catch an early bus to Bunbury on Thursdays and Fridays, to do his course. Monday to Wednesday he would be working at school to complete all his other schoolwork. Eventually he would be doing one day per week with a builder, where he will prove his practical skills. Jim will need to complete 220 hours in the workplace.

• This course will take one year to complete (Yr. 11) then he may continue to do part school and part work placements to trial some other specialties – brick, carpentry, painting - or do more work with a builder who wants and full time apprentice once he has completed his WACE.

Some Scenarios

• Felicity is a year 11 student who has commenced several general courses and a Certificate II in Sports Coaching. She has now decided she has really enjoyed working with children and would like to expand her studies in year 12 to include Certificate II Childcare.

• She will need to put her application in by August of year 11. Resume, School Report and Work Experience all help when applying.

• The course will run at TAFE for one semester for one day per week. Felicity will complete her other courses on her days at school. As part of her course she will also need to consider work placement in a childcare centre as she needs to complete 110 hours of practical work to prove her skills.

• All of her TAFE work and Work Experience will combine with her general courses, and Certificate II Sports Coaching an allow her to complete her WACE. Felicity will need excellent timemanagement skills to juggle her TAFE and school requirements.



Some Scenarios

• Sam is extremely excited about the events, arts and tourism industry. She already volunteers for Arts Margaret River and has a great connection with community.

• For her year 11 and 12 she has decided to combine a Certificate III in Events with a Certificate III in Visual Arts. This combines two of her great loves and means she will have some choices about pathways forward. This will be a lot of work as there will be extra time needed for events, and art takes extra studio time to complete pieces. These Certificate courses will run for the full two years.

• For her other courses she has decided to do General but combine this with work experience in the industry, perhaps using some of her volunteer experience for credit, to ensure her resume show all the elements of her passion.

• She has decided that this is something she wants to do more of and has discovered that she can do a higher-level certificate online that can formalise her training and ability to teach.

• Lily also wants to complete her WACE during year 11 and 12. She has decided to combine her online course with her other subjects at school. She will need to do extra study outside school but is willing to put in the time.

• At the end of year 12 Lily will have her WACE, completed her Certificate IV in Dance, and be ready for the next steps in her pathway forward (a Diploma or Advanced Diploma then potentially University).

• She has decided to apply for the Certificate IV in Health and Nursing Preparation, having achieved strong B grades in Math and English. It has been suggested that if she combines ATAR English, with his Certificate course, she could be a strong candidate for entry to several universities, for portfolio entries.

• Jo may also wish to do some volunteer work, or complete some industry specific work experience in a health environment, which will assist in her application. She will need to make sure she also completes all his other general courses with strong grades to be competitive in the next step.

Some Scenarios



• Fred is keen to work in IT. He loves helping people solve their technical problems with computers and other media.

• He has been talking to the local Computer retailer and they are thinking about putting on a Junior. Fred mentioned he is keen to learn more but would still like to complete his WACE at school. He finds out more about the requirements of a Traineeship. 7.5 hours per week minimum and training for 12-18 months.

• The Retailer agrees this would be a great opportunity. They contact the school, get some help to put the contracts together and sign up for the beginning of the year. Fred does some of his training (Cert II or III IDMT) online, works in his Traineeship one day per week, then completes his other courses at school.

• When he completes year 12, he will have a great report and resume that includes very useful industry experience, have a great reference from his boss, and be in a perfect position for further training or full-time traineeship at a higher level (Diploma) that could be a pathway to University.

VET courses are diverse and have many levels. Finding the right courses and committing to it may be challenging. Starting on the VET pathway can be rewarding. Be proactive and consider all your options.
