2016 Equestrian Interschool Championships

Being new to this school, I was so pleased I could join this team along with Jessica Ridley. Planning started on the very first day of Term 1. In the school holidays (April 21-23) we packed ourselves, our horses and families for 3 days of competition representing our school at the State Equestrian Centre in Brigadoon. This is a massive competition with 219 riders on 255 horses from 69 schools, including primary schools. It gets a little crazy after 3 days of stressful competition and camping out with our ponies, but Jess and I made it through and achieved some of our best scores to date in our respective classes.

Competition includes Dressage, Show Jumping, Combined Training, Vaulting and Show Horse/Hunter classes with Eventing having taken place earlier this year at Capel. Both Jess and I competed in Dressage and Show Horse/Hunter events. Fortunately we had great weather, and achieved competitive results in all our classes, with competition very tight and just 2% making the difference between most places.

I'd like to thank both Margaret River Senior High School for allowing us to represent the school and Corien Ridley for being an awesome team manager and arranging uniforms, saddle blankets, brow bands, caps and for co-ordinating

everything up in Perth. When I finished my show horse class the judge said she loved our uniforms! I did feel we looked really good. Also thank you to the many amazing parents and students who supported our Sausage Sizzle to fund raise at the Big Band Picnic, which proved to be a lovely

evening and helped raise our entry fees to this event which are quite significant.

I hope next year we are joined by some more of our classmates, as it is a great atmosphere to get out there and experience what other students are achieving with their mounts.

I was fortunate enough to represent Margaret River Senior High School along with Lauryn Hall at this year's State Equestrian Interschool Championships held at the State Equestrian Centre in Perth during the April holidays. It was a really busy competition for us competing in Dressage and Show Hunter Classes. There were 219 riders on 255 horses making it one of the biggest equestrian events held in Western Australia. It is a really big competition and in my divisions there were 60 riders in my Preliminary dressage test and 65 in my Novice dressage test. I was very lucky to get to ride in the indoor arena for my Novice test, coming 15th in that division.

I rode in the International Arena outdoors for my Preliminary test coming 10th, only 2.85% behind the winner. These were both personal best's percentage wise for me and for my horse Diamond Dream Flying Spirit.

I would like to thank my team mate Lauryn who supported me when I rode and to MRSHS for letting us represent our school in our chosen sport. Next year I hope other riders at the school can come along and have as much fun as Lauryn and I did camping with our horses and enjoy the experience of big competitions.

Students heard stories of 7 refugees from Burma, South Sudan and Afghanistan; fleeing persecution and starvation, waiting amongst tens of thousands of other refugees in camps, perilous journeys by boat and finally being settled in Australia. Ms Sayer was impressed with the insight of the students' comments and questions during the discussion.

Year 12 Certificate II Outdoor Recreation Canoeing Camp

In week 3 of this term, the Year 12 Certificate II Outdoor Recreation classes culminated their canoeing and camp craft lessons with a two-day paddle, down a 28km section of the Blackwood River and an overnight camp at Sues Bridge. There was a healthy flow on the Blackwood creating some technical sections of swift water to test the group's skills. Water levels also afforded the students to swim sections of rapids and perform throw bag rescues for each other. Students were also assessed on campsite skills such as food preparation, equipment management and minimal impact techniques.

Assessments carried out related to the Demonstrate Canoeing Skills, Perform Water Rescues, Maintaining an Overnight Campsite and Minimal Impact Techniques Units of Competency.

The conduct of the groups both on the river and around the campsite was exemplary, resulting in a positive experience for all concerned.




Investigation of Water, Heat and Temperature

School Drug Guidelines

Margaret River Senior High School has developed School Drug Education Guidelines that aim to keep young people safer and encourage a shared commitment to drug education between staff, students and parents.

The guidelines outline the procedures that exist within school to manage issues and incidents involving possible drug use and providing support intervention. The school Health and Wellbeing Committee has taken a drug education leadership role and developed the guidelines in consultation with staff, students, parents and community members. This addresses drug education and necessary related interventions in a caring and consistent manner within the Margaret River Senior High School community.

In conjunction with the guidelines, the Health curriculum has been revised to include the latest evidence based information and resources. Classroom programs focus on skill development, develop students' knowledge and understanding, attitudes and values and promote help-seeking behaviour. Learning is extended from the classroom to promote parent support of drug education programs.

This whole school approach promotes a sense of shared responsibility for student welfare and contributes to the prevention and reduction of harm to students, staff and the wider-school community.

Career Centre -Term 2

The VET team has been off and running ensuring our students make a smooth start in their VET Courses within the South West. We have 12 students travelling to Bunbury to start or continue their Pre-Apprenticeship and VET in School Programs.

Over 23 Year 11 and 12's are enrolled in Community Services and Rural Operations at the Margaret River Education Campus and we have 5 Certificate 2 courses within the Margaret River Senior High School's program.

Our Year 11 students are preparing for their first Workplace Learning experience from the 20th of June - 1st July.

The Year 12's have reflected on their progress and choices made in 2015 and now start to make more informed decisions about their work placement. Our Year 12's are just about to commence their first placement and our Year 11 students will attend work placement at the end of Term 2.

We took a large group of Year 10 students up to Perth to attend the Career Expo at the Convention Centre. This gave the students the opportunity to explore all career pathways with representation from all universities and training providers, emergency services, armed forces and private colleges. Students walked away with a variety of resources and a better understanding of future possibilities. We will run another Career Expo in August which will give an opportunity for the students who missed out to attend.

It was wonderful to see so many Year 10 parents attend our first Year 10 to11 transition information session. This was an overview of the requirements for Year 11 and 12 and the choices available at MRSHS. There is a second parent night later this term. This session will outline in detail the courses available, the processes involved and allow for guestion time for more individual concerns and gueries.

Over Week 4 we had the Apprenticeship and Traineeship Company come and run a 'Try - a - Trade' 3 day program. This exposed the students to 3 trades giving them an opportunity to learn new skills and think about future training opportunities.
